ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

Retirement Highlights for Fiscal Year 2024

Education

In 2024, the Retirement Office received positive feedback from active employees with the new educational learning presentation titled "Retirement Readiness Review". The comprehensive pension calculation which includes a personalized pension calculation, 401k-MAP, 457-RSVP, 457-ROTH, 175/185 Supplemental Share, and DROP account, provides a holistic review of an employee's retirement status and allows the employee to adjust as they plan to meet their retirement goal.

The Retirement Readiness Reviews were such a hit in 2024, the Retirement Department partnered with Human Resources and launched a Financial Wellness course where employees can receive 2 hours of Financial Wellness leave which would count towards the 8-hour Wellness Leave limit for the fiscal year.

Likewise, the 2024 Retiree Educational Seminar designed to cover areas like Social Security, Medicare, and IRS RMD's (Required Minimum Distributions) was also a hit. To date, two seminars are slated for fiscal year 2025. The event was held at the City of Tallahassee Smith-Williams Center with approximately 150+ retirees in attendance.

There were 24 New Employee Orientation sessions conducted virtually, and 3 Police and 3 Fire orientation sessions conducted in person during FY 2024 with 305 new or rehired employees in attendance; Retirement is an integral part of these sessions. In addition, pension information was presented during quarterly review sessions that were conducted by our Empower Representative Jay Nix.

<u>Information</u>

Eligible retirees and beneficiaries received an annual Cost-of-Living Adjustment (C.O.L.A) of 3%, and General Employees (Permanent and Vested) were credited 3% interest on their pension accounts. C.O.L.A notices were provided to all eligible retirees via their earnings statement, which included their effective C.O.L.A date.

There were 30 requests for buyback calculations in FY 2024. Of those calculated in FY 2024, eight employees purchased one or more types of service, totaling just over \$261,992. Since inception, \$17,171,908 has been paid to purchase additional service.

During the FY2024 Health Insurance Open Enrollment, educational materials were processed and mailed out to the over 2,000 retirees with approximately 69 retirees enrolling in the City of Tallahassee Medicare Advantage health plan.

In November 2024, a retiree appreciation event was held at the Tallahassee Automobile Museum. Over 355 participants attended this retiree event.

<u>Defined Contribution, Deferred Compensation and Supplemental Share Plans</u>

The Roth 457 was implemented and made available to participants in the spring of 2020. Over the past four years of implementation, there are 440 enrollees.

Supplemental share plan information is as follows:

- Share amounts are contingent upon the amount received from the state each year and the total number of shares that are distributed each October 1st.
- The 2024 amount received for Firefighters was \$1,438,439.48, which included a surplus of \$195,612.82.
- The 2024 amount received for Police Officers was \$2,028,149.50.






